Students paint snowplows

Snowplows in New Freedom, Shrewsbury and York Township will sport a new look next winter — painted with flowers, snowmen, “Think Spring” signs and scenes from the movie “Frozen.”

The American Public Works Association Central Chapter of Pennsylvania selected a project that involved high school students painting snowplows as a service project for public works departments, according to Don Bortner, president of the York branch.

The organization took the lead in the project, and Bortner along with Bob Gates, and Jim Phipps from the branch and board members of the central chapter contacted Kathy Ingoglia, the Diversified Occupations coordinator for West York Area School District, to discuss the idea.

She, in turn, contacted schools in York County to see if there was interest, and Susquehannock and Dallastown high schools agreed to participate, Bort-

New Freedom, Shrewsbury and York Township dropped off their snowplows at the schools at the beginning of April, and stu-

dents completed their work just before the end of the school year.
